<b>Format</b>	<p>The workshop uses brief lectures, a quick review of the salient literature, videos and interactive activities.</p> <p>Cases are presented from various general practice situations and participants learn to quickly analyse and correct jeopardising behaviours in the case situations. In addition to the interactive exercises, participants are provided with a bibliography of the relevant research and copies of the most relevant papers prior to attendance at the workshop.</p>
<b>Premise</b>	<p><b>88% of patients prefer to stay with their own Doctor for palliative care</b></p> <p>General Practitioners play a pivotal role in palliative care, often being the central point for coordination of various activities and services. The challenge for General Practitioners is to not only provide relief for a patient's physical symptoms, but also treatment for the emotional and spiritual suffering associated with the end of life.</p>
<b>Overview</b>	<p>Effective Palliative Care in General Practice focuses on the illness and healing model. It encourages participants to develop strategies, within an interactive, experiential context, to help them more effectively manage the palliative care process for patients and their families. Key areas explored in this workshop include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>■ Why a GP should provide palliative care</li><li>■ What skills are needed to practice palliative care</li><li>■ How to give bad news in the palliative care setting</li><li>■ Transition from curative to palliative care - how you do it</li><li>■ How to resource yourself and your practice.</li></ul>
<b>Presenter</b>	Each workshop is conducted by an accredited trainer who is also a practicing GP and has a real understanding of the issues facing general practitioners on a daily basis.
